

**List of recommended, allowed and prohibited interventions in a shoreline strip**  
 (This information does not replace the legal texts of the Municipality's By-law #110-2007)

Subject	Recommended (no permit required)	Allowed (with permit)	Prohibited
<b>Vegetation</b>	Let the vegetation grow freely and allow Mother Nature to do her work. In a short time, shrubs adapted to shoreline conditions will naturally take their place.	Naturalize your shoreline with grasses, shrubs and trees. The plants must be indigenous, that is, native to lake and waterway shorelines. Get your inspiration from nearby nature.	Controlling the vegetation: mowing the lawn and clearing the brush. It is also forbidden to spread fertilizer.
<b>Access to the water</b>	Shoreline with a gentle slope (10 metres wide)		
		Create an opening with a maximum width of 2 metres, at an angle to the shore (when there is a public access to the water).	Open up a driveway (asphalt, concrete, stone, sand) for the launching of a boat.
		Create an opening with a maximum width of 3 metres, at an angle to the shore (when there is no public access to the water).	Create an opening of more than 2 or 3 metres, depending on the presence or absence of a public access.
	Shoreline with a steep slope (15 metres wide)		
		Build a staircase on stilts, placed at an angle with the shoreline and allowing vegetation to grow underneath the stairs.	Build a staircase with stones or wood that creates excavation and backfill in the shoreline strip.
	Create a winding path with a maximum width of 2 metres.	Create a straight path more than 2 metres wide.	
<b>Green window</b> (opening in height, in the vegetation)	Maintain a vegetation screen, to enhance the natural beauty of the landscape.	Prune to create a window up to 5 metres wide, pruning trees and shrubs to a height of 1.5 metres.	Cut trees to create a view of the water.
<b>Beach</b>	Let the beach naturalize itself, naturally.	Naturalize your beach with indigenous plants.	Create, maintain or replenish a beach.
<b>Accessory equipment</b>	None	Relocate the accessory equipment outside of the shoreline strip.	All accessory equipment is prohibited: patios, pools, spas, water basins, reservoirs, playgrounds and other similar equipment.
<b>Docks</b>		Install a dock, shelter or pier on stilts, posts or made of floating platforms.	Build a concrete dock or on a crib
<b>Construction</b>	No new construction	Maintain and repair existing structures authorized under a permit.	Build or expand a main or accessory building (some exception apply, please consult the by-law).
